James McCowan Memorial Social History Society

The James McCowan Memorial Social History Society, dedicated to recording and preserving the social history of the *ordinary* Scottish-Canadian, held a community awareness night for the McCowan Log Cabin (c.1815) Museum, Scarborough, in March 1990. The focus of the evening was on potential educational programmes, based on the history of the cabin and its occupants from 1850 to 1900, that may be offered at this restored building.

A proposed publication, *Lessons From the Past: The William P. McCowan Log Cabin*, will include the proceedings of the Awareness Night, other papers on potential public educational programmes, and papers relating the McCowan cabin to our cultural and material heritage in general. The Society is seeking the assistance of scholars who may wish to contribute papers on the following topics: the value of education; sexual morals and promiscuity; the role of religion in society. Guidelines for authors:

Manuscripts in English should be sent to R.D. Gidney or R. Coulter, Co-editor, *Historical Studies in Education*, Faculty of Education, The University of Western Ontario, London, Ontario, Canada, N6G 1G7. Manuscripts in French should be sent to R. Heap, Rédactrice adjointe, *Revue d'histoire de l'éducation*, Département d'histoire, Université d'Ottawa, Ottawa, Ontario, Canada, K1N 6N5. Text and endnotes should be double-spaced. For English manuscripts, follow *Chicago Manual of Style*, 13th edition, and *Oxford English Dictionary* spelling. French manuscripts should follow Eugénie Lévesque, *Guide d'Édition* (Québec: Éditeur officiel du Québec, 1980). Both English and French manuscripts should also follow, as a supplement for specifically Canadian usage, *The Canadian Style; A Guide to Writing and Editing* (Toronto and London: Dundurn Press in co-operation with the Department of the Secretary of State of Canada, 1985)/*Guide du rédacteur de l'administration fédérale* (Ottawa: Direction de l'information, Bureau des traductions, 1983). Three paper copies should be submitted. Authors whose manuscripts are accepted for publication will be asked to supply a copy on diskette, preferably IBM, or IBM-compatible (MS-DOS).
